Facts About the JIM BOEHEIM Basketball Camp

The camp is conducted by James A. Boeheim Enterprises, Inc. as an education program for Syracuse University.

SESSIONS: Camp will begin with registration at the dorm from 11:00 am - 1:30 pm. THE FIRST BASKETBALL SESSION WILL BEGIN AT 2:00 PM. The first meal will be dinner on registration day and campers will have lunch on the last day. Check out times are 1:30 pm for NIT, 2:30 pm for NCAA, and 3:30 pm for NBA.

PARENTS ARE WELCOME TO WATCH THEIR SON'S GAMES.

TEAM CAMP: Sun., July 24 - Thur. July 28 there will be a team camp along with the regular camp. A team can sign up to play together as a team if they wish. Specify school name & other campers that will play together as a team.

CANCELLATIONS: \$100 administration fee will be retained if you cancel. After June 1st, refunds (less the administration fee) will be made only for medical reasons when accompanied by a letter from a physician. Refunds will not be mailed out until after August 31, 2005. If a camper is injured and must leave camp early, the refund will amount to a pro-rate for room/board only.

DISCIPLINE: Any violation of camp regulations (damage to school property, disrespect to coaches, or other behavior deemed detrimental to the group) may result in immediate dismissal from camp. If a camper is dismissed or voluntarily withdraws from camp, there will be no refund.

BOARDING CAMPER: An overnight camper will participate in the entire schedule. Campers will eat 3 meals a day and stay overnight in the dorm. **\$420.00**

EXTENDED DAY CAMPER: An extended day camper will arrive daily at 8 a.m. to have breakfast, participate in the entire day schedule and depart the Carrier Dome after the evening game at 9 p.m. **\$335.00**

DAY CAMPER: A day camper will arrive daily at 9 a.m. in the Carrier Dome for roll call, participate in the morning and afternoon schedule, eat lunch in the cafeteria and depart at 5p.m. in the afternoon. **\$235.00**

TRANSPORTATION: We will provide free shuttle service from local train station, airport and bus terminal. Call to make arrangements.

DEPOSIT & BALANCE: A \$100.00 deposit (non-refundable) must accompany each application for each session registered and the balance must be paid by May 15, 2005. If you register after May 15, 2005, you must include the full amount of tuition for all sessions attending. Please write son's name on check. **Canadian checks accepted in U.S. funds only.** There is a \$25 fee for bounced checks.

ACCOMMODATIONS: Big Orange campers will be housed two to a room in an SU dormitory on campus. Please make sure you list your roommate preference on the application since all room assignments will be made 2 weeks before registration. Anyone attending both Session 2 & Session 3 can stay the one night between the two sessions in an additional room and board fee of \$40.00. We need to know ahead of time to make arrangements. The coaches/counselors live on the floor with the campers.

MEALS: The professional Kitchen staff of Syracuse University Dining Halls plan and prepare every meal. All you can eat and drink will be served three times daily in a campus dining facility.

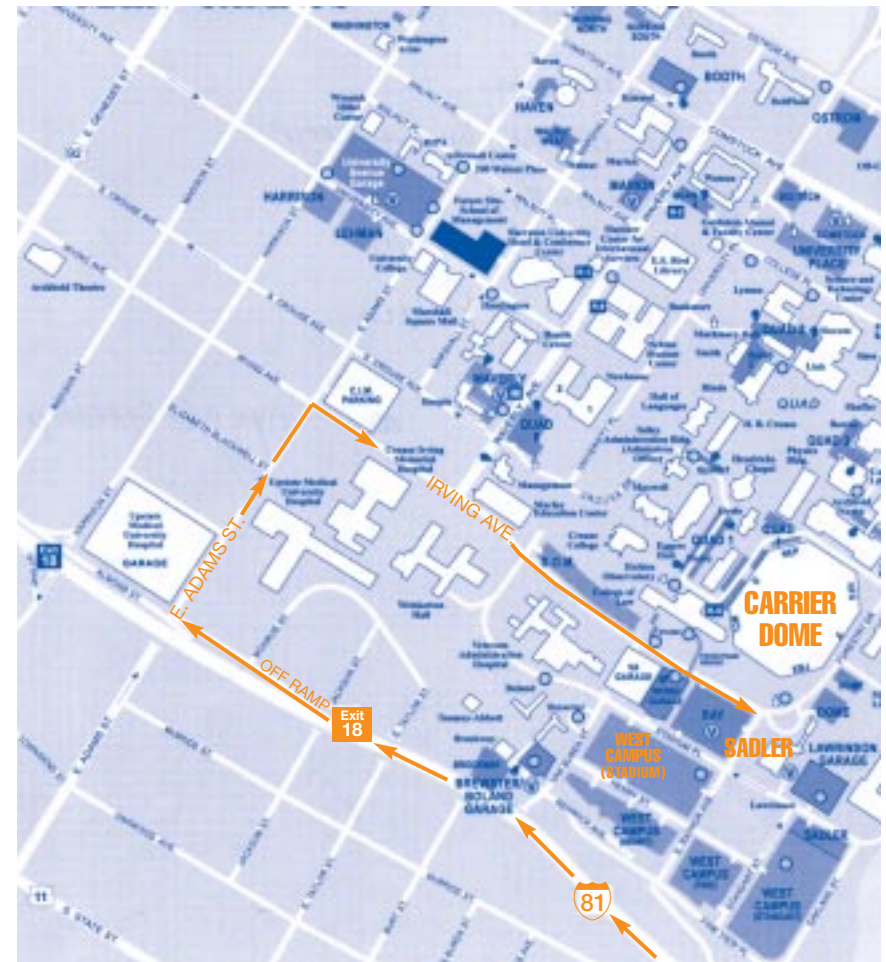

In Accordance with New York State Law:

Meningococcal Meningitis is a bacterial illness affecting the brain. It can be spread by a cough, sneeze, kiss, sharing drinks, or by any other direct contact or airborne means of transportation. Therefore, students/campers residing in small areas, such as dormitories, are at an increased risk for contracting the illness.

The signs and symptoms of meningococcal meningitis are similar to the common flu often making it hard to detect. The signs and symptoms include the following: high fever, nausea, vomiting, fatigue, headache, stiff neck/back, skin rashes, and confusion. Frequently, not all signs and symptoms occur, and the illness may progress rapidly. Treatment of meningococcal meningitis is antibiotic therapy.

A vaccination is available, and is an effective way to help prevent meningococcal meningitis, although any vaccine is not an absolute guarantee. There are rarely side effects associated with this vaccination. Syracuse University summer camps will not provide the meningitis vaccine. Contact your family care provider for information regarding availability and associated costs of the vaccination.

WHAT TO DO AFTER YOU HAVE REGISTERED

Set up your room.

After registration is over all campers will report to the Carrier Dome.

SUGGESTED LIST OF WHAT TO BRING

Basketball Equipment: Pair of basketball sneakers (comfortable - broken in) extra laces

7-10 pairs of athletic socks (wearing double socks is recommended)

5-7 pairs of playing shorts, 5-7 T-shirts (you will receive a **Big Orange Camp** shirt the last day of camp), athletic supporters.

General: Jacket/sweatshirt, swim suit, towels, pillow and pillowcase, blankets, sheets, or sleeping bag, toiletries (soap, toothbrush etc.), pocket money (including coin) for minor expenses such as snacks or vending machines and video machines, fan.

You may purchase linens for \$6.50 **at registration** which includes pillow, 2 sheets, blanket, and towels.

We have a shop to buy shirts, shorts, etc.

VERY IMPORTANT

Lock your room before you leave.

Put your key and meal card in your mail box and keep it there.

Write your name on your meal card.

ALWAYS BE ON TIME TO THE COURTS SO WE MAY BEGIN ON SCHEDULE RULES AND REGULATIONS

Cafeteria: 1. Shirts must be worn in the dining room.

2. No bare feet in the dining room.

3. Take only what you will eat . . . seconds and thirds are available.

4. No food out of the cafeteria.

5. You cannot order food from outside the University.

6. All trays must be returned to kitchen conveyor belts.

General: Report all injuries, no matter how slight, to the TRAINER

You are not allowed to leave campus under any condition.

Basketballs must be kept in the Dome at all times.

If you have your own basketball here, leave it in your room.

Proper basketball attire at all time (socks, sneakers, shorts, shirt).

Absolutely no jewelry can be worn during games.

If anyone needs sneakers or other athletic supplies, these will be available in the first floor lounge or see Coach Fine.

Washers and dryers are available in the dorm . . . inquire at the desk.

KEYS AND MEAL CARDS SHOULD BE KEPT IN YOUR MAILBOX. LOSS OF KEY OR MEAL CARD . . . REPORT TO MAIN DESK AND TO COACH FINE. REPLACEMENT KEYS COST \$32 AND MEAL CARDS COST \$5.

POOL HOURS - TO BE ANNOUNCED.

Attention: LEAVE SCREENS IN YOUR ROOM ALONE.

Any room damage is your responsibility.

No fooling around on elevators. YOU WILL BE DISMISSED FROM CAMP.

Bed check every evening.

No gambling, smoking, etc.

Cars in parking lot with parking pass only . . . see Coach Fine.

DAMAGES TO UNIVERSITY PROPERTY WILL BE CHARGED DIRECTLY TO YOU.

BEFORE ANYONE CAN LEAVE CAMP ON THE LAST DAY, YOUR ROOM HAS TO BE CLEANED AND CHECKED OUT BY A STAFF MEMBER.

Rules & Regulations

It is a pleasure to have the basketball camp operating on the Syracuse University campus. This is a great location, an educational atmosphere, and it will be an exciting week. Being here carries with it certain responsibilities. There are others on campus as well as in the camp and we must not interfere with their programs. We must have rules in which we operate. These are as follows.

1. MAIL: There is one delivery of mail each day, this is distributed by the coaches.

2. PHONE CALLS: You may make phone calls using the pay phones in the dorms. The University's extension phones will not call off campus.

3. ROOMS: To be kept clean and livable.

4. BREAKAGE: Inspection of rooms is made at the end of the session. If furniture or other equipment is broken or damaged, campers will be required to pay for it. Furniture may not be removed from any room.

5. COUNSELORS: There are college student counselors in addition to the coaching staff. Each is here to help you enjoy your stay. Reports of misconduct, illness, breakage, etc. should be made to Coach Fine or your Commissioner.

6. DRESS: Campers are expected to dress appropriately for each activity. Bare feet are allowed in your room or pool ONLY.

7. ALARMS: For the protection of the campus community, the investigation of any false alarms will be referred to the civil authorities for investigation and judgement. Any camper found guilty will be dismissed from camp.

8. ALCOHOL, DRUGS, SMOKING: Any camper found drinking alcohol, or engaged in taking illegal drugs, including marijuana, will be dismissed from camp and sent home without benefit of any refund. Parents will be immediately notified and requested to provide proper departure of the camper from the campus immediately. At no time, and under no conditions, will smoking be allowed.

9. DINING ROOM: Please check the dining schedule carefully. Be sure that you are in the serving line at the proper time. All trays must be taken to the Tray Return Area. Campers must attend all meals. Do not lose your meal cards. You will not be able to eat, and it will cost you \$5.00 to get a replacement card.

10. OUT OF CAMP PERMISSIONS: Must see Coach Fine or your Commissioner.

11. RADIOS AND CD PLAYERS: Radios and CD players may be used in your rooms. Be considerate to others and keep the volume down. If they are too noisy, we reserve the right to prohibit your listening in your room. They are not to be played after 11:00 PM.

12. QUARTERS: All campers are checked into their rooms at the proper time. Counselors are to report to the administration any campers who fail to conform to these rules. Campers must be in their rooms at 10:30 PM each night with lights out at 11:00 PM.

13. LAUNDRY: There are laundry facilities available in the dorms. Check at the front desk.

14. ILLNESS: If you are ill, report this at once. Tell one of the counselors and they will contact either Coach Fine or your Commissioner, who will see that you get proper attention. Unless you are ill or excused, you are required to attend every basketball session. There is a trainer at the training room at the Dome during all basketball sessions as well as at the dorm overnight.

15. WALKING IN ROADS: We share the campus streets with vehicles. Be careful and walk on sidewalks. Use stairs when available.

16. SITTING OR LEANING OUT OF WINDOWS: Not under any circumstances are you allowed to remove window screens. We do our best to prevent accidents, and we need your help. Immediate actions will be taken against campers who do not comply.

17. KEYS: If you lose your key, it will cost you \$32.00 to get a new one. If you lock yourself out of your room or your roommate does, you can get a locked out key at the main desk. It must be returned immediately after use.

18. USE OF POOL: The pool hours will be posted at the dorm and will be announced at the first camp meeting.
