### KOWALEWSKI HAS CAREER DAY



**Joe Kowalewski**

Senior tight end **Joe Kowalewski (Warners, N.Y.)** caught a career-high seven passes against Virginia and surpassed the 300-yard receiving mark for his career on a 31-yard touchdown reception from junior quarterback **Perry Patterson (Lancaster, Pa.)** ... Kowalewski had a career-best 96 receiving yards for the game ... It was the most receiving yards by an SU tight end since Chris Gedney caught six balls for 103 yards at West Virginia on Oct. 17, 1992 ... Kowalewski is SU's leading receiver through three games with nine catches for 117 yards and one touchdown ... In 12 games in 2004 Kowalewski had 14 catches for 181 yards ... For his career, Kowalewski has 26 catches for 361 yards and two touchdowns.

### ORANGE DEFENSE PRODUCES TURNOVERS



**Ryan LaCasse**

The Syracuse defense produced three turnovers in the 27-24 loss to #25/20 Virginia ... **SU's turnover margin of +2.67 leads the nation** ... Senior defensive end **Ryan LaCasse (Stoughton, Mass.)** intercepted a pass by UVA quarterback Marcus Hagans in the SU endzone to thwart a Cavalier scoring drive ... Senior **Steve Gregory (Staten Island, N.Y.)** recorded the fifth interception of his career and sophomore **Dowayne Davis (Bronx, N.Y.)** had his first career interception against Virginia ... SU's 10 turnovers in three games ties for 10th nationally ... The SU defense is ranked sixth nationally in pass defense (128.3 yards per game) and 24th in total defense (292.67 yards per game) and is fourth in pass efficiency defense (82.05).

### LAST SECOND DRAMATICS

Virginia's game-winning field goal with :01 remaining in the game marked the first time since 2000 that SU has lost on a field goal as the final play of the game ... In 2000 the Orange lost at Cincinnati, 12-10, on a 47-yards field goal by Jason Mammarelli ... The last time SU won on a last second field goal was in 1989 when John Biskup hit a 24-yarder against East Carolina with :04 remaining in the game ... SU won that game 18-16.

### SYRACUSE PERFECT IN THE REDZONE

Syracuse has come away with points every time it has entered the red zone this season ... The Orange is 6-for-6 when breaching the opponent's 20-yard line (four touchdowns, two field goals) ... SU is one of two teams in the BIG EAST to have scored one every one of its red zone possessions (Cincinnati, 6-6) ... SU's performance inside the opposition's 20 this season is a marked improvement against last year when the Orange finished last in the conference in red zone offense, scoring on 64.3 percent of its red zone possessions (27-of-42, 17 TDs and 10 field goals).

The most experienced in the group are senior defensive end **James Wyche (Roosevelt, N.Y.)**, who has played in 36 games, including 34 starts and senior **Steve Franklin (Dover, Del.)**, who has 26 starts in 27 games played during his two-plus seasons at SU.

### THE SYRACUSE-FLORIDA STATE SERIES

Florida State leads the all-time series versus Syracuse, 4-1 ... FSU won the only other meeting between the two schools at Doak Walker Stadium, 46-14, in 1991 ... SU's lone series victory came in 1966 by the score of 37-21 at Archbold Stadium ... In that contest SU legend Floyd Little carried 20 times for 193 yards and three touchdowns ... NFL Hall of Famer Larry Csonka also gained 65 yards on the ground on 17 attempts. ... Csonka finished the 1966 campaign with 1,012 yards, the 10th-highest single-season total in team history ... Csonka and Little rank third (2,934 yards) and fifth (2,704 yards), respectively in career rushing yards at SU ... In last year's meeting, **Perry Patterson** passed for 207 yards in a 17-13 loss at the Carrier Dome ... Orange running back Walter Reyes caught a career-best six passes in the game and Luke Cain made a career-high nine tackles.

SU cornerback **Terrell Lemon** came to Syracuse from Miami, Fla., while several Florida State players from Miami stayed closer to home ... FSU cornerbacks J.R. Bryant and Trevor Ford, offensive guard Jacky Claude, defensive end Willie Jones and quarterback Tommy Keane all originated from Miami ... Orange wide receiver **Landel Bembo** and cornerback **Marcus Clayton** are originally from Tallahassee, Fla. along with FSU fullback James Coleman, cornerback Antonio Cromartie, linebacker Rodney Gallon, cornerback Joe Manning, tight end Matt Root, wide receiver Fred Rouse, linebacker Ernie Sims and quarterback Wyatt Sexton ... Bembo and Clayton each attended Amos P. Godby HS, while FSU's Cromartie, Gallon, Manning and Rouse all went to Lincoln HS ... Orange linebacker **Tommy Harris** is from Daytona Beach, Fla., while Florida State linebacker Buster Davis, defensive end Anthony Kelly and quarterback Xavier Lee also call Daytona Beach home.

### ON THIS DATE IN SU FOOTBALL HISTORY

#### October 1

- SU is 12-3, including eight-straight wins from 1921-1977.
- SU's first five victories on this date all came by shutouts ... The Orange has outscored its opponents 410-195 all-time on Oct. 1.
- SU is 2-3 away from home on this date.
- In the Orange's last win on Oct. 1, an upset against #14/10 Virginia Tech, Kirby Dar Dar ran for a career-high 108 yards and three touchdowns ... Malcolm Thomas ran for a career-high 145 yards, while Kevin Mason threw for a career-high in the air with 183 yards ... SU trailed 20-14 with less than eight minutes left, but two rushing scores sealed the win for the Orange.

### SU BEST IN THE BIG EAST IN PUNTING AVERAGE

The Orange is currently leading the conference in punting (39.3 yards per punt) ... SU has kicked 22 times for a league-best 936 yards ... Senior **Brendan Carney (Valley Forge, Pa.)** ranks third in the league in punting average (42.5) and is tied for 28th in the nation in the same statistic ... He is second on SU's career punting average ledger (42.9) and is tied for ninth in school history in number of punts (139) ... Carney's 5,958 career yards is the sixth-highest total in team history ... He has booted 31 kicks inside the 20-yard line for his career including two this season (1 vs. Buffalo and 1 vs. Virginia)..

### LOCAL PRODUCTS MAKE GOOD

The Orange have had contributions this season from several players that came to SU from local high school programs ... Senior tight end **Joe Kowalewski (Warners, N.Y.)** is the Orange's top receiver with nine catches for 117 yards and a touchdown in 2005 ... He caught a career-best 96 receiving yards versus Virginia and has 26 receptions for 361 yards for his career ... Senior tailback **Damien Rhodes (Manlius, N.Y.)** is SU's top rusher with 375 yards on 71 carries (5.1 avg.) and five touchdowns ... Rhodes is tied for 11th all-time in career touchdowns (22) ... He also ranks ninth in career kickoff return yardage (810), eighth in kickoffs returned (39), 11th in all-purpose yards (3,217), seventh in yards per game (103.6) ... Sophomore linebacker **Vincenzo (Utica, N.Y.)** has appeared in every game so far this year and has five solo tackles .... His teammate at Proctor High School **Nick Santiago (Utica, N.Y.)** has three stops and has played in SU's first three contests ... Junior linebacker **Jerry Mackey (Freeport, N.Y.)** was the Orange's top tackler last season with 106 stops, has six tackles in 2005, including one for a loss ... Freshman linebacker **Mike Stenclik (Webster, N.Y.)** has one tackle this year ... Rookie receiver **Bruce Williams (Syracuse, N.Y.)** became the first true freshman to appear in a season-opening game since 1997 and has one catch on the year for 10 yards.

### TURNOVERS - TAKING MANY MORE THAN WE'RE GIVING

Syracuse leads the nation in turnover margin at +2.67 ... The Orange defense has forced a total of 10 turnovers (six interceptions and four fumbles) in three games, while turning the ball over just twice (two interceptions) ... SU's 10 takeaways in the most in the BIG EAST and is tied for 10th in the nation ... The Orange's six interceptions is tied for the 14th in the country ... SU forced five turnovers against West Virginia in the season-opener, the most by a BIG EAST team in 2005 ... Senior free safety **Anthony Smith (Hubbard, Ohio)** leads the team with two interceptions ... He picked off two passes against Buffalo, adding to his season turnovers total ... He recovered two fumbles and forced another in the season-opener against West Virginia ... Linebacker **Tommy Harris (Daytona Beach, Fla.)** and **Tanard Jackson (Silver Spring, Md.)** each have also each recovered fumbles for SU ... The Orange is one of 11 teams in NCAA Division IA that had not lost a fumble on the season ... Syracuse has put the ball on the ground five times this year, but recovered all five.

#### NOT MUCH LAUNDRY

Syracuse was penalized just once versus Virginia, for a total of 15 yards ... It was the 17th time since 1957 the Orange was whistled for just one infraction in a game ... The last time SU played an entire game without being called for a penalty was at West Virginia on Nov. 23, 1957... The Orange has been called for 19 penalties in 2005 for a total of 143 yards ... Syracuse is second in the BIG EAST Conference in fewest penalty yards per game at 47.7 ... Connecticut leads the league in fewest penalty yards per outing (35.3, 16-106).

#### SU COMMUNITY RALLIES TO SUPPORT RELIEF EFFORT

Volunteers from the Syracuse community, including 48 SU student-athletes from the men's and women's swimming and diving, women's rowing, and men's and women's track & field teams, raised more than \$57,000 for the American Red Cross relief effort for those affected by Hurricane Katrina ... On September 17, SU student-athletes will participate in another fundraising effort – the eighth annual Dollar Days at the Dome – prior to SU's football game against Virginia For the past seven years Orange student-athletes have raised money prior to one football game a season to support the United Way, collecting more than \$40,400.

#### SU FANS HELP THOSE IN NEED

Saturday, September 17th was SU's eighth annual Dollar Day at the Dome ... More than 200 SU student-athletes surrounded the Carrier Dome to encourage donations to the United Way of Central New York ... The student-athletes collected \$5,468 for the worthy cause ... During the past eight years, SU student-athletes have collected more than \$45,000 for the United Way, including a record \$10,807 in 2001, which was raised two weeks after the September 11 attacks on the U.S. ... The United Way of Central New York helps thousands of people in our community with more than 100 quality programs at its 40 member agencies ... The Allstate Insurance Company donated \$1,000 to the American Red Cross Hurricane Relief Fund for each SU field goal versus Virginia on Sept. 17 and gave \$300 to SU's general scholarship fund for a field goal and \$100 for each PAT ... The Orange raised \$1,600 (1 FG, 3 PATs)..



**JONES DOING IT ALL**

Redshirt freshman running back **Kareem Jones (Lansingburgh, N.Y.)** had three yards rushing on two attempts against Virginia ... Jones caught a career-long eight-yard reception against UVA ... He also returned a kick for a career-best 35-yards ...

Against Buffalo he ran for a career-best 56 yards on 14 carries against Buffalo ... He played in the first game of his career against West Virginia, rushing the ball three times for 14 yards ... He caught one pass for two yards against the Mountaineers ... He also had two kickoff returns for 38 yards, including his first career return for 19 yards ... Jones' kick return average of 22.75 yards per return ranks 57th nationally.

**KRAUTMAN DIALED IN ON PAT ATTEMPTS**

Sophomore **Ricky Krautman (Wyckoff, N.J.)** was three for three on PAT attempts against Virginia ... Against Buffalo he made the first field goal of his career when he converted a 21-yard attempt ... He made a career-high four PAT's versus Buffalo ... Against West Virginia, he connected on his first

career PAT ... Krautman had missed his one previous PAT against Boston College in 2003 ... He redshirted in 2004.

**LANE CATCHES CAREER-BEST FOUR PASSES**

Junior wide receiver **Tim Lane (San Diego, Calif.)** caught a career-high four passes against Virginia gaining a total of 15 yards ... Against Buffalo he had a career-day catching three passes for a game-high 62 yards, including a 44-yard reception from Perry Patterson, the longest of his career ...

Against West Virginia he had his first reception for the Orange and finished the game with two catches for 16 yards.

More than 23.5 million people have passed through the revolving doors of the Carrier Dome for more than 1,740 events since the building's first public event on September 20, 1980, when the Orange football team beat Miami (OH), 36-24, in front of 50,564 fans, which still remains the largest crowd for a football game in the Dome ... During one stretch the basketball team led the nation in attendance 11 straight seasons from 1984-85 through 1994-95 ... SU regained the attendance title in 2004-05 averaging 22,978 fans per game ... Last season the average attendance for football games was 37,657 ... SU is 103-44-2 all-time in the Dome (.691), 34-11-1 (.739) in the Dome against current BIG EAST teams and 22-7 (.759) against teams the Orange will host this season ... Aside from just hosting football, the Dome is the site for all of the exciting action of the Syracuse men's basketball and men's and women's lacrosse games ... In 2003, more than 25,000 fans packed the Dome to celebrate Syracuse's first men's basketball national championship ... On February 5, 2005, 33,072 fans were on hand for "Break the Record Night" to watch the Orange beat the Fighting Irish of Notre Dame, 60-57.

**GREGORY MOVES UP PASSES DEFENDED LIST**



**Steve Gregory**

Senior cornerback **Steve Gregory (Staten Island, N.Y)** intercepted his first pass of the year, and fifth of his career, against Virginia ... The pass defended moves him into a tie for fourth all-time with 36 passes defended in his career ... Gregory also posted six solo tackles and a tackle for a loss for one yard ... Against West Virginia, he led the team with nine tackles, seven solo, including one for a

loss of one yard, in his return to the defensive side of the ball ... Against Buffalo he returned the first punt of his career for seven yards ... ## SU'S NEW LOGO GOES BACK IN TIME

Syracuse University Director of Athletics Dr. Daryl Gross stepped back in time with the official mark of the SU Athletics Department. Gross implemented a Block S as the official athletics logo in late August.

"The Block S allows us to respect the past and represent the future," Gross said.

"The S represents not only the University and its athletics programs, but the entire Syracuse community."

The Block S was officially established as the insignia of athletic achievement at a meeting of the Athletic Association in April, 1893.

Clarence Goodwin '94, manager of the 1893 football team, and later a Supreme Court Justice in Chicago, introduced the resolution adopting the insignia and awarding the Block S to those who had participated in three games of baseball or football. George Bond 1894 bought a sweater and had an orange colored Block S cut out and sewed on it. Bond wore the sweater in a baseball game in the spring of 1893. This was the first official Block S ever made and worn.

SU's student-athletes are awarded a Block S letter certificate at the end of each season based on criteria established by their coach. In addition, senior student-athletes receive a Block S blanket from the Athletic Department prior to graduation.

"I really want to give special thanks to the SU Publications Department (who helped design the new logo)," Gross said. "I believe in Syracuse people doing Syracuse projects because there is so much talent and so many resources here. Special thanks to the 'S' team."

The 2005 version of the Block S is the University's primary athletics mark. The interlocking SU will still be seen on some of SU's team uniforms as the transition to the new Block S is implemented.

## ORANGE IS IN THE APPLE



SU Director of Athletics Dr. Daryl Gross is leading the charge for the "Orange is in the Apple" campaign ... The kickoff was Friday, August 26, unveiling a Spectacular Bulletin (120' by 18') on the corner of 7th Ave and 49th Street, facing north, northwest, and west.

"The 'Orange is in the Apple' campaign is designed to establish a tangible presence with Syracuse university supporters in New York City," Gross said. "We have so many alumni, fans and friends in the metropolitan area, as well as the entire state of New York, whom we want to represent as part of our Syracuse athletics family. We want the Orange on everyone's mind. What better place to get your message across in the world than New York City?"

The combined impact of the three facings of 7th Ave. and 49th Street creates an astonishing display that overwhelms the intersection commanding attention from cars and pedestrian traffic ... People in automobiles will see this Spectacular heading into Bow-Tie of Times Square ... This location will also be seen nine blocks away (Central Park) in the location known as the "triple treat." One million people will see this daily.

"We are New York's college team and this is a solid indication toward that theme," Gross said.

## SU ADDS WSNR 620AM TO RADIO NETWORK

The Syracuse ISP Sports Network added WSNR 620 AM, a New York City station owned and operated by Sporting News Radio, announced Syracuse University Director of Athletics Dr. Daryl Gross ... WSNR will carry all of SU's 2005 football games ... The Syracuse ISP Sports Network includes 17 stations across the state of New York and extends in to New Jersey and Vermont.

"As another part of our 'Orange is in the Apple' campaign we have decided to air all Syracuse football games in New York City," Gross said. "This will give our many Syracuse friends, fans and alums a chance to follow the Orange throughout the season. We anticipate an exciting successful season and this will allow our loyal followers to enjoy it. I have dealt with Sporting News Radio management and talent for the past few years and have always found them to be professional, experienced and enthusiastic. As the co-defensive coordinator at the University of Texas in 2004, Robinson was the mastermind behind the Longhorns' defensive unit for the 11-1 squad that beat Michigan in the 2005 Rose Bowl ... Robinson's Texas defense finished the season ranked 18th in scoring defense (17.92), 16th in rushing defense (107.42) and 23rd in total defense (320.08) in the country ... The Longhorns held six of Texas' 12 opponents to 14 points or less. In addition, the defense was also able to hold two of the nation's top scoring teams, Oklahoma and Texas Tech, 23 points and 14 points below their season averages, respectively.

#### SUPER BOWL SUCCESS

Head coach Greg Robinson has two Super Bowl Championship Rings to go with his eight collegiate bowl game victories ... Robinson was the defensive coordinator for the 1997 and 1998 NFL Champion Denver Broncos ... Robinson established his reputation as a defensive mastermind in Denver, where he transformed a struggling defense into a Super Bowl Championship unit ... After inheriting a club that ranked last in total defense in 1994, Robinson made an immediate impact in his first season with the team, as the Broncos finished the 1995 campaign ranked 15th in the same category... By 1996, he had turned Denver into the league's fourth-rated defensive unit, and by season number three in '97, the Broncos were on their way to the first of two straight Super Bowl titles.

#### Playoff Impact

During his stellar six-season stay in Denver, the Broncos made four playoff appearances and claimed back-to-back World Championships with wins in Super Bowls XXXII and XXXIII, making them just one of six franchises in NFL history to accomplish a Super Bowl repeat. In that six-year span, Denver compiled a 64-32 (.667) regular-season record.

The Broncos ranked in the NFL's top 10 in total defense during three of Robinson's six seasons at the club's defensive helm, finishing seventh in '99 (297.1 ypg), fifth in '97 (291.9 ypg) and fourth in '96 (279.4 ypg) ... Denver's defenses produced three top 10 rankings in scoring defense - eighth in '98 (19.3 ppg), sixth in '97 (17.9 ppg) and seventh in '96 (17.2 ppg) ... The team's pass defense ranked among the league's top 10 in four of his six seasons with Denver finishing eighth in '99 (188.5 ypg), fifth in '97 (179.3 ypg), 10th in '96 (196.2 ypg) and ninth in '95 (206.1 ypg) ... Denver's run defense ranked in the league's top 10 three times during Robinson's tenure ... Denver led the NFL in run defense in 1997 (83.2 ypg.) and ranked third in 1998 (80.4 ypg) ... The performance of Robinson's defense throughout the '98 playoffs was paramount to Denver's quest for a second straight title ... The Broncos allowed opponents just 53.0 rushing yards per game in the postseason and forced a remarkable 13 turnovers in just three games ... Denver allowed only 25 total points during that stretch.

### 2005 Game Summaries

#### Game #1

**Syracuse** 7  
**West Virginia** 15

September 4 at the Carrier Dome, Syracuse, N.Y.

SU lost to BIG EAST rival West Virginia, 15-7, in the season-opener for both teams. A crowd of 45,418 gathered to watch the beginning of head coach Greg Robinson's era. It was the largest crowd to see an SU home opener since 1999.

The Orange scored the first points of the game when senior Damien Rhodes scored on a five-yard touchdown run. A 20-yard punt return by redshirt freshman J.J. Bedle set up the SU scoring drive. Rhodes finished the game with 46 yards rushing on 16 carries and a career-best seven receptions for 21 yards.

After the Orange defense forced a WVU punt, the Mountaineers tied the game when Eric Wicks intercepted Orange quarterback Perry Patterson's pass on the first play of the drive and returned it 31 yards for a touchdown with 12:24 remaining in the second quarter.

West Virginia took a 10-7 lead on a 33-yard field goal by Pat McAfee with 5:53 left in the third quarter. In the fourth quarter the Mountaineers added a safety with 8:02 left in the game to take a five point lead, 12-7, and then finished the scoring with a 26-yard field goal with 3:26 remaining in the contest.

SU's defense forced five West Virginia turnovers, including four fumbles. In the first quarter senior free safety Anthony Smith forced a fumble, which was recovered by junior Tanard Jackson, and then Smith recovered a fumble that was forced by senior James Wyche. SU senior Kader Drame forced a fumble in the second quarter that was recovered by senior Tommy Harris.

In the third quarter, Jackson recorded SU's fourth turnover of the day with an interception. The final WVU turnover was Smith's second fumble recovery with 11:39 remaining in the game. That turnover was caused by SU sophomore Tony Jenkins.

Senior Steve Gregory led SU with nine tackles, including seven solo and one for a loss, and Kelvin Smith had eight tackles, including six solo.

Orange punter Brendan Carney had a single-game career best 481 yards on 11 punts, including a 58-yard punt in the first quarter.

Prior to Sunday's game, Syracuse volunteers raised more than \$57,000 in relief efforts for those affected by Hurricane Katrina.

The Orange offense and defense turned in strong performances in SU's 31-0 shutout of Buffalo before 34,442 fans. Running back Damien Rhodes rushed for a career-high 236 yards and four touchdowns for the offense that gained 486 total yards and Anthony Smith recorded two interceptions to lead the SU defense that allowed just 123 total yards of offense in the game.

Rhodes rushed for 27-, 50-, and 54-yard touchdowns in the first half to lead SU to its third-straight win against the Bulls. The win was also Greg Robinson's first victory as a head coach.

Smith's pair of interceptions marks the first time an SU player has picked off two passes since Smith did it in 2003 against Notre Dame.

The shutout is the first for the Orange since 1997, when SU beat East Carolina 56-0. Syracuse held its opponent to less than 200 yards of total offense for the first time since 2002 (Rutgers) and allowed less than 10 first downs for the first time since 1999 (Temple).

SU put its first points on the scoreboard on its second possession of the game. Tight end Tom Ferron caught his first career pass from Perry Patterson and ran down the sideline for a 29-yard gain. On the next play, Rhodes scampered to the end zone for a 27-yard touchdown run. Rhodes scored again, on a 50-yard run in the second quarter.

On the Bulls next possession, Smith recorded his first interception of the game at the UB 49-yard line.

Orange kicker Ricky Krautman's first career field goal, a 21-yarder, gave SU a 13-0 lead.

When the Bulls drove into SU territory on their next possession, Smith stepped in again for his second interception of the day. Rhodes gave SU a 24-0 lead with his third rushing scored of the day, a 54-yard scamper run up the middle.

On SU's first possession of the second half, Patterson found wide receiver Tim Lane down the field for a 44-yard completion down to the UB three-yard line. Rhodes found the end zone for the fourth time in the game for the game's final score.

#### Game #3

**Syracuse 24**  
**#25/20 Virginia 27**

September 17 at the Carrier Dome, Syracuse, N.Y.

Virginia kicked a 19-yard field goal as time expired to beat Syracuse in front of 40,027 fans. The game marked the Orange's 25th anniversary celebration of the Dome, which opened on Sept. 20, 1980.

Virginia started its game-winning drive on its own 41-yard line with 6:25 left in the game. Cavaliers quarterback Marques Hagans scrambled for 26-yards down to the SU 29-yard line. After grinding the ball down into the red zone, the Cavaliers were forced into a fourth-and-inches situation. Peerman pounded the ball up the middle on fourth down, getting UVA inside the 10-yard line for a first down with less than a minute left in the game. After two more rushes, the Cavaliers called timeout to set up the game-winning kick by Connor Hughes.



**Perry Patterson**

In the opening quarter, senior Damien Rhodes broke loose for a 22-yard gain up the left sideline. Junior Perry Patterson then dropped back to pass on third-and-seven, and then scrambled to the end zone to give SU a 7-0 lead with 11:39 left in the first quarter.

On the ensuing UVA drive, Peerman got the ball at the one-yard line and was hit at the line, but a second effort put him to cross the goal line, tying the game at seven.

In the second quarter, UVA's Tom Santi came down with a 24-yard pass play, giving UVA a first-and-goal on the eight-yard line. On third-and-goal, Hagans found Peerman in the end zone for his second score of the day to give UVA a 14-7 lead with 7:36 left before intermission.

On Virginia's first possession of the third quarter, Connor Hughes came on to kick a 26-yard field goal, which he converted to give Virginia a 17-7 lead.

SU quickly responded, as Patterson faked a handoff to Rhodes and rolled out to his right, finding tight end Joe Kowalewski all alone for a 31-yard touchdown cutting the deficit to 17-14.

On the ensuing drive, Virginia stretched its lead back to 10 when Michael Johnson took a handoff for a 70-yard touchdown scamper, putting Virginia back up 24-14.

After trading punts, SU took over at its own 20-yard line. Following a long drive, Patterson rolled out to his left and found a clear path to the end zone, cutting the Cavaliers lead to 24-21 with 13:17 left in the game.

After a UVA punt, SU scored again on a John Barker 27-yard field goal, the first of his career, to tie the game 24-24 and setting up UVA's game-winning drive.

SU's defense recorded three interceptions, by Steve Gregory, Dwayne Davis and Ryan LaCasse.
