## 107th Syracuse Year Begins With Dick's NIT Season Tip-off

Syracuse begins its 107th of college basketball when it hosts the 2007 Dick's Sporting Goods National Invitation Tournament Season Tip-off in the Carrier Dome. The Orange are paired with Siena in game one while Fairleigh-Dickinson and Saint Joseph's will square off in the nightcap.

The two Monday night winners will advance to play in the first game on Tuesday evening. The victor in that game moves on to the tournament semifinals in New York.

The three other NIT Season Tip-off host institutions are Ohio State, Texas A&M and Washington.

Syracuse and Siena have met seven times previously and the Orange have claimed each outing. The most recent encounter between the two clubs, on November 25, 2005, resulted in a 96-77 Syracuse victory. Six of the seven games have been at the Carrier Dome.

Siena opened its season at James Madison on Friday and lost, 100-88. The Saints led by as many as eight in the second half, 57-49, but the host Dukes with a 29-18 run over the final 9:17. Siena sophomore Edwin Ubiles led all scorers with 27 points and the backcourt pairing of sophomore Ronald Moore and junior Kenny Hasbrouck each scored 19.

## Greene, SU Offense Explodes In Exhibition Win Against LeMoyn

Freshman forward **Donte Greene** had 26 points in 23 minutes and

Syracuse's offense surpassed the century scoring mark in a 109-59 exhibition victory against Division II LeMoyn on November 7. The Orange opened up a 17-point halftime margin by outscoring the Dolphins, 57-24, in the second half.

Syracuse connected on .592 of its shots (42-of-71). The Orange outscored LeMoyn in the paint, 62-36, and in fast-break situations, 24-4.

Greene led five players in double digits: freshman forward **Rick Jackson** had 17 points, freshman guard **Jonny Flynn** had 15, junior guard **Eric Devendorf** added 12 and junior center **Arinze Onuaku** completed the group with 11.

Jackson topped all rebounders with 16 caroms, including 12 in the second half. Sophomore forward **Paul Harris** had nine boards to go along with eight points. Devendorf's 10 assists led both clubs.

Freshman guard **Scoop Jardine** was solid off the bench, tallying six points, four assists and three steals in 21 minutes.



## Onuaku's Double-Double Helps SU Past St. Rose

Junior center **Arinze Onuaku** had 10 points, 10 rebounds and four blocked shots and Syracuse defeated College of St. Rose,

80-71, in the club's exhibition opener on November 4. It was Onuaku's first official action in two seasons as he missed his sophomore campaign with a knee injury. Onuaku turned in the double-double effort in 26 minutes of work.

Freshman forward Donte Greene had an impressive Orange debut, tallying all 16 of his points in the first half. He canned 6-of-10 from the field, including a 3-of-4 effort from the three-point line, in the opening period of play. Greene finished with seven rebounds.

Junior guard Eric Devendorf played a squad-high 37 minutes and finished with 16 points.

Sophomore forward Paul Harris had a workmanlike 12 points, 10 rebounds, three assists and a steal. Freshman guard Jonny Flynn, Harris' scholastic teammate at Niagara Falls High School, contributed nine assists and a club-best three steals.



## Devendorf Makes Wooden Award Preseason List

Syracuse junior guard **Eric Devendorf** is among the top 50 preseason candidates for the Men's 2007-08 John R. Wooden Award,

the nation's most coveted college basketball award, announced October 24 by The Los Angeles Athletic Club's Wooden Award Committee. The Award is named for the three-time college basketball All American, 1932 Player of the Year and ten-time national championship coach at UCLA.

The list is composed of 50 student athletes who, based on last year's individual performance and team records, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most coveted trophy. These top 50 candidates are comprised of returning players. Transfers, freshmen, and medical redshirts are not eligible for this preseason list, but will be evaluated and considered for both the Midseason Top 30 list and the National Ballot. Players not on the preseason list are eligible for the midseason top 30 and ballot. Last year, Kevin Durant of the University of Texas was the first freshman to win the Wooden Award.

In January, the Wooden Award committee will release the Midseason Top 30 list, followed by the distribution of the National Ballot to more than 1,000 voters in early March. The 10-player Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced the Tuesday after the "Elite Eight" round of the NCAA Tournament is completed.

The 2008 Award ceremony, which will include the presentation of the Men's and Women's John R. Wooden Award, the Wooden Award All-American Teams, and the Legends of Coaching Award to recipient Pat Summitt of the University of Tennessee, will be held at The Los Angeles Athletic Club the weekend of April 11-13, 2008.

The Orange men's and women's basketball teams were greeted by 4,834 fans and treated the faithful to an evening of entertainment that featured master of ceremonies Bill Raftery, color analyst for CBS and ESPN.

The men's squad was in the midst of a full-court scrimmage, officiated by head coach Jim Boeheim, when Paul Harris led Onuaku with an alley-oop pass. Onuaku slammed the ball home with extra authority and then scrambled to evade the shattered remains of the backboard. The play was later featured on ESPN's Sportscenter.

## Syracuse Grabs BIG EAST Attention

The Syracuse men's basketball team was tabbed fifth in the 2007-08 BIG EAST Preseason Coaches' Poll. **Eric Devendorf** received Preseason All-BIG EAST distinction while freshman guard **Jonny Flynn** and freshman forward **Donte' Greene** were voted Preseason Co-Rookies of the Year.

Georgetown (217 points) and Louisville (217) share the BIG EAST's top spot with Marquette (191) and Pittsburgh (170) finishing three and four, respectively, in front of the Orange (153).

Flynn and Greene headline Syracuse's highly-touted 2007-08 recruiting class, ranked second and fourth nationally by Scout.com and Rivals.com, respectively. The duo became the fourth BIG EAST Preseason Rookie of the Year selections in the last six seasons for the Orange. Former SU standout and current NBA superstar Carmelo Anthony (2002-03), Devendorf (2005-06) and Paul Harris (2006-07) are past honorees.

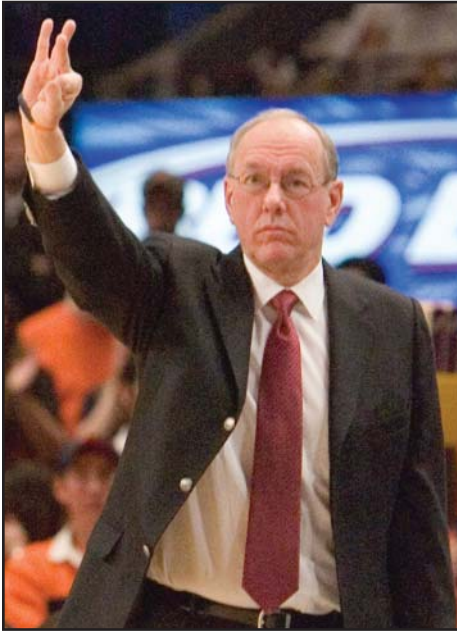

SU coach **Jim Boeheim** earned the 750th win of his collegiate career when SU defeated San Diego State, 80-64 in the National Invitation Tournament, on March 19, 2007. He is tied for 12th on the all-time Division I victory list.

## The Book On Boeheim

**Boeheim** has a career record of 750-264 (.740). **Boeheim** is eighth among active Division I coaches in winning percentage. **Boeheim** is tied for fourth among active Division I coaches in wins, trailing only Bob Knight (Texas Tech), and Lute Olson (Arizona). He is 21st on the all-time percentage ledger.

The 2007 NIT berth gave SU 30 post-season appearances under **Boeheim**, including 25 NCAA Tournaments. His SU teams have won **21-or-more games in 29 seasons**. He has guided his alma mater to the NCAA title game three times, winning it for the first time in 2003. **Boeheim** is the winningest coach in BIG EAST history with a 333-182 (.647) overall conference record.
